

So David bought the threshing floor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver. We often hear that nothing cheap is worth having. King David said he would not give God something that cost him nothing. True giving is not giving unless you can feel it. Giving away clothes or household items we are finished with or no longer want is admirable and a nice gesture, but it doesn't equal real giving. Real giving occurs when we give somebody something that cost us something or causes us to make a sacrifice. We've all had those testing times when God has asked us to give away something we like or want to keep for ourselves.

When we consider how God gave His only Son for us because He loves us so, how can we hold anything back from Him, including ourselves. While we can never equal God's sacrifice for us, we must give back to Him in a way that means something. 
