A Word From Pastor Butch... Greetings in the name of Jesus! Because of Valentine's Day, the month of February has long been a special time of the year for expressing our love to the one who means the most to us. Love is special. Without love in our own hearts or without someone to love, we feel so empty. Love is important. Love can fill us with joy, or it can break our hearts. It can be mature, but it can also be immature. It can be very selfish, or it can be very giving. Soon, Susan and I will have been married fifty-four years. Over those years we have seen our love grow and grow. Both of us agree that the biggest factor in the maturing of our love is Jesus Christ. With Jesus in our hearts, our love can grow from, "I love you because I need you," to, "I need you

But I would like you to consider thinking about love in a different way. We often read 1 Corinthians 13 when we think about love. But that passage is not about how we ought to love our spouse, though it is often used in that context. Rather, it is teaching us how Jesus loves us and how we ought to love others. But let's take it a step further. Read Matthew 5:43-48. This passage teaches us that we are to love those who we wouldn't normally show love to. We are to love our enemies, along with

loving those we normally love. Loving those who are against us is a difficult thing to do, but if we look to Jesus, He shows us that is exactly what He did when He died on the cross for you and for me. I encourage you to extend love to those you don't love on a normal basis. You might be surprised with the outcome! *In Christ, Scottie*

<u>YES, NO, or NOT Yet!</u> Why you must persist in Prayer...Prayer moves the heart of God. Prayer is the difference between you fighting for God and God fighting for you. When you hit your knees, God extends His powerful right hand. He fights your battles for you. Drawing prayer circles is a metaphor that simply means praying until God answers. It's not just praying, it's praying through. Prayer circling is a determination to pray as long as it takes, even if it takes longer than you ever imagined. Sometimes God will push you to your absolute limits - the limits of your faith, the limits of your patience, the limits of your gifts. That's how God stretches faith & builds character. Don't lose heart. Don't lose hope. Don't lose faith. Don't lose patience. Drawing prayer circles isn't some gimmick to get what you want from God. God is not a genie in a bottle, and your wish is not His command. His command better be your wish! If it's not, you won't be drawing prayer circles, you'll end up walking in circles. You've got to praise Him if the answer is yes, trust Him if the answer is No; and if the answer is Not Yet, you've just got to keep circling (praying).
