SLBC Purpose



A Word From Pastor Butch... Greetings in the name of Jesus!

In February, Valentine's Day reminds us and encourages us to express our love to those closest to us. It's a good thing. But, be reminded that nobody loves us more than God. God is love (1 John 4:8). From His heart of love, He gave us Jesus (John 3:16) and Jesus died that He might give us abundant and eternal life. What an expression of love.

How can we show God our love? Let me share four ways. 1) By living in obedience to Him, John 14:15. An obedient life is a changed life. The change expresses our love for God. 2) By expressing our love in words and in song, Psalm 100 says, "Come into His presence with singing" and also, "Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise". 3) By joining with others to worship and celebrate God and His love (Hebrews 10:25). 4) One final way is to serve the Lord. Deuteronomy 10:12 says, "....serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul." The heart has long been seen as the center of our emotion and our love. Valentines Days' best-known symbol is a heart.

If we really think about it, all of these things will be helped and promoted in our lives by an active involvement in a Church, the body of Christ. *We Love you! Butch*

<u>YES! NO! or NOT Yet!</u> Why you must persist in Prayer...Prayer moves the heart of God. Prayer is the difference between you fighting for God and God fighting for you. When you hit your knees, God extends His powerful right hand. He fights your battles for you. Drawing prayer circles is a metaphor that simply means praying until God answers. It's not just praying, it's praying through. Prayer circling is a determination to pray as long as it takes, even if it takes longer than you ever imagined. Sometimes God will push you to your absolute limits - the limits of your faith, the limits of your patience, the limits of your gifts. That's how God stretches faith & builds character. Don't lose heart. Don't lose hope. Don't lose faith. Don't lose patience. Drawing prayer circles isn't some gimmick to get what you want from God. God is not a genie in a bottle, and your wish is not His command. His command better be your wish! If it's not, you won't be drawing prayer circles, you'll end up walking in circles. You've got to praise Him if the answer is yes, trust Him if the answer is No; and if the answer is Not Yet, you've just got to keep circling (praying).
